



Packing list

Mozambique can be warm to extremely hot during the months of May, September, October and November with maximum temperatures ranging between 85f – 110f. The months of June, July and August are winter and nighttime temperatures can drop below 65f, warming up to mid 70's and 80's.

The following list is only a general guideline of what to bring on a hunt. There is daily laundry service except for days of arrival/departure.

Clothing

- 2 pairs of good walking boots or running shoes (run in)
- 1 Pair of swamp boots – these shoes need to be able to drain water – we have had great success with something similar to “All Starts”. (Buffalo hunts only)
- 4 Pairs of good socks
- 3 Pairs long hunting pants (Camo, Dark khaki or Olive Green)
- 3 Pairs short hunting pants
- 3 Pairs hunting shirts (Camo, Dark khaki or Olive Green)
- 1 Hunting Jacket – (Camo, Dark khaki or Olive Green)
- Leafy Suit (if it is your preference to use one)
- 1 Warm sweater
- Light Weight rain gear
- Casual wear for evenings
- Cap or Hat



Extra gear

- Binoculars and Rangefinder
- Camera/s
- USB flash drive or SD card for copying your PH's pictures onto
- Flashlight
- Pocket knife
- Sun Block (at least SPF 30)
- Small backpack for daily equipment while hunting
- Lip balm
- International plug set – conversion to South Africa 220V
- Insect repellent
- Spare batteries if needed
- Toiletries
- Prescription drugs if needed
- Malaria prophylaxis

Archery equipment

- Bow and selected arrows
- Sufficient sharp broadheads
- Trigger (preferably a backup as well)
- Quiver
- Allen key set
- Soft bow bag (for traveling while hunting)
- Hard bow case (for traveling in between destinations and internationally)

Permits and Licenses:

- Each hunter needs to pay a \$50 per day community fee. This will be added to the total amount of your hunt.
- Furthermore, license fees needs to be added to the trophy fee for each species that is hunted. License fees can be found on our pricelist.



Traveling process

- The first step is to fly into OR Tambo International Airport (Johannesburg) from where you'll have to take a SA Airlink flight to Beira (Mozambique).
- Upon arrival in Beira you will be met by one of Safari Air LTD's pilots where they will help you through customs.
- The last part of the journey is an hour charter flight from Beira to Camp where you'll be met by our friendly staff.
- I will recommend traveling with a hard case for your archery equipment. This way you are guaranteed that your equipment will still be intact when you arrive in camp.

What to expect in Mozambique

Our area in Mozambique is a very special concession and one of the few remaining truly wild areas left in Southern Africa. From the flight into camp you will already experience the wild and untouched area you are about to hunt in.

The Camps will make you feel at home with all the modern luxuries from home.

This is a concession that will give

you as a bowhunter the opportunity to hunt Africa in its wildest form. You'll have a lot of opportunities at species that are not commonly found. This is a 100% free-range area with no strings attached.

FAQ

How many hunting days are necessary?

This will depend on what species you have on your wishlist, but for a normal plainsgame hunt 7 days will be adequate. If you do wish to hunt Cape buffalo 7 days is adequate, but we recommend taking an extra day or two.

What hunting methods will be used?

Hunting will be done by sitting in handpicked locations out of blinds overlooking watering holes and by hunting on foot (spot and stalk). Both these methods proved to be very efficient and successful. Hunting on foot proved to be a very efficient and successful method especially on Buffalo, Sable, Lichtenstein's Hartebeest, Nyala and the Pygmy Antelopes.

Gear recommendations?

Plainsgame:

Any modern compound bow with a draw weight of 60-70 pounds. We

recommend an arrow of at least 400gn with a well build and reliable broadhead.

For women and younger hunters we recommend 40 pounds of draw weight on small to medium game. For larger game we would recommend a draw weight of 47 pounds or higher. In these cases we will give you guidance after booking a hunt, so make sure to ask us if you have any questions.

Dangerous Game:

For buffalo we recommend a setup of at least 70 pounds draw weight (preferably 75+ pounds) with an arrow of at least 750 gn and a 2 blade fixed blade broadhead.

Our recommendation to clients is to practice up to at least 60 yards. This way your shot opportunities will be much more.

What types of food and drinks can I expect?

Breakfast will consist of a normal continental breakfast and cereals.

Lunch will be either in camp or a packed lunch if you are spending the whole day in the bush. Lunch will normally consist of chicken, venison, vegetables and freshly baked breads.

Dinners are a 3 course meal and you can definitely expect to have some of the animals you hunted to be served on your hunt.

A list of beverages and alcoholic drinks will be sent to you upon booking a hunt to confirm what your preferences are.
